No-No's of Composting

This is one of our 3-stage composting bins. Each of the 3 compost bins has a specific purpose in the rotation. The signs above each one indicates the stage of that particular bin.

Blighted tomatoes have been put into a resting bin, despite the instructions that were indicated on the sign. This can compromise the composting process.

Please follow the directions provided and only put appropriate materials in the compost bins in order that the facilities can function according to their intended purpose.
